#### Students Return to In-Person Learning January 19th

I know that part of the elevated enthusiasm for the new year is the return of students to inperson learning. Students will continue to learn in Phase 1 (remote learning) until January 15<sup>th</sup>. Starting January 19<sup>th</sup>, Kindergarten through 5<sup>th</sup> grade will go to school five days a week, in Phase 4, following health protocols.


As we move closer to in-person learning we will keep you informed of safety protocols, materials they will need to bring, and daily schedules.





### **Report Cards**

We are pleased to announce report cards will be available to you electronically in <u>ParentVUE</u>, by 4PM, Monday, January 11<sup>th</sup>. If you have forgotten your password click 'Forgot Password' on the Account Access page. Note, PVUE can be accessed through a secure login using the web portal (<a href="http://www.psdschools.org/pvue">http://www.psdschools.org/pvue</a>) or app which can be downloaded from the <u>iTunes Store</u> for Apple (iPhone) devices or <u>Google Play</u> for Android devices. #### **Switch to Standards Based Report Cards**

PSD has updated elementary report cards and moved to a standards-based system. If you have a child in middle school, you are familiar with this system. The new report cards align with how they are mastering grade level standards, and not simply a percentage. Teachers are able to provide more specific feedback on the actual skill or task and what the student needs to practice in order to improve.

Your students will now receive a mark of 1, 2, 3, or 4. A mark of 3 indicates they are exactly where we expect them to be at this time.

Effort & Personal Development	Explanation of Marks	Achievement
	Consistently shows a thorough understanding of the concepts or skills and extends understanding beyond the requirements of the standards.	4 = Exceeding Expectations
3 = Meeting Expectations	Shows a complete and correct understanding of the concepts or the ability to perform the skills as articulated in the standards.	3 = Meeting Expectations
2 = Approaching Expectations	Shows partial mastery of prerequisite knowledge and limited or incomplete understanding of the concepts or skills as articulated in the standards.	2 = Approaching Expectations
1 = Beginning Expectations	Shows a beginning understanding of the concepts or performance of the skills as articulated in the standards.	1 = Beginning Expectations

This representation, from Clear Creek Independent School District in Texas, is a great visual.



Please understand it will take some time for everyone to adjust to this new system. This includes shifting our classroom practices and assessments, training students, and providing more standards information to families. For example, previous progress reports this semester may not align directly with this new grading scale, as teachers are working to adjust their own grading practices".

Families will be able to access report cards in ParentVUE at the end of each semester in both January and June.


Once we transition to Phase 4 on January 19<sup>th</sup>, meals will be available for students.



### **Friendly Health Safety Reminders**

Friendly Health Safety Reminders for when we return to in-person learning on January 19<sup>th</sup>. As we move closer to in-person learning we will keep you informed of safety protocols, materials they will need to bring, and daily schedules.



Protocols following critical, major or minor symptoms

### When can staff, students return to work and school in PSD following a positive COVID-19 symptom screen?

Note: This guidance is NOT intended for cases or close contacts of COVID-19. A confirmed COVID-19 case or close contact should follow public health isolation or quarantine instructions for return to school/work.

The Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment recently released new guidance for K-12 schools to guide response to the COVID-19 pandemic. A group of nurses and PSD staff evaluated the new guidance, which is now in effect and outlines when staff and students can return to work and school. Please note that PSD's adopted guidance has been reviewed by the Larimer County Department of Health and Environment and is in some ways stricter than the state's guidelines. As a reminder: PSD staff and students are required to wear a mask on school grounds.



#### **Critical Symptom Response:**

Follow home isolation for **10 days** following symptom onset AND be **24 hours** fever free without use of feverreducing meds before returning to school. COVID-19 test recommended.



#### **Major Symptom Response:**

- If symptoms resolve within 24 hours of onset and stay resolved an additional 24 hours, return to school. (48 hours total)
- 2. If symptoms DO NOT resolve within 24 hours, either:
  - Follow home isolation for 10 days following symptom onset AND 24 hours fever free without use of fever-reducing meds before returning to school.
  - Get a polymerase chain reaction, or PCR, COVID-19 test. If test is negative, return to school once symptom-free for 24 hours. If positive, follow home isolation for 10 days following symptom onset AND 24 hours fever free without use of fever-reducing meds before returning to school.

- Hazard Young Attea & Associates, a search firm hired by the Board of Education, will compile input gathered from the survey, forums and invite-only focus groups and create a leadership profile report that will be presented at the board's public Feb. 9 meeting.

The school board will also solicit diverse ideas from numerous stakeholder groups, including parents/guardians and students, through a series of facilitated, invitation-only, online January forums. Event information is posted on the <u>PSD Superintendent</u> <u>Search web page</u>, which is the primary source of information for the hiring search. We encourage everyone to share their voices as part of this important process.

Once on the <u>PSD Superintendent Search web page</u> users can translate the content. Click on the word "Translate" along the top, green navigation bar and select your desired language from the list displayed.
