### 2021-22 PSD Return to Learn/Work after Major or Minor Illness Symptoms

Note: This guidance is NOT intended for cases or close contacts of COVID-19. A confirmed COVID-19 case or close contact should follow public health isolation or quarantine instructions for return to school/work.

## Feeling feverish, having chills, temperature of 100.4° F or greater New or worsening cough temperature of 100.4° F or greater New or worsening cough difficulty breathing

### **Major Symptom Response:**

- If symptoms resolve within 24 hours of onset follow regular return to school illness policies if all symptoms have resolved or are improving. (Must have no fever, vomiting or diarrhea in last 24 hours).
- 2. If symptoms DO NOT resolve within 24 hours, either:
  - Follow home isolation for 10 days following symptom onset AND 24 hours fever free without use of fever-reducing meds before returning to school.
  - Get a PCR or molecular COVID-19 test.
  - · If the test is negative, return to school once symptoms have resolved or are improving.
  - If positive, follow home isolation for 10 days following symptoms onset AND 24 hours fever free without use of fever-reducing meds before returning to school.

# Minor Symptoms: Sore throat Runny nose or congestion Muscle or body aches Minor Symptoms: Headache Fatigue Nausea, vomiting Diarrhea

#### Minor Symptom Response:

- If symptoms resolve within 24 hours of onset, follow regular return to school illness policies if all symptoms have resolved or are improving. (Must have no fever, vomiting or diarrhea in last 24 hours).
- If symptoms are mild only and resolve within 48 hours of onset, follow regular return to school illness policies if all symptoms have resolved or are improving. (Must have no fever, vomiting or diarrhea in last 24 hours).
- 3. If symptoms DO NOT resolve within 48 hours, either:
  - Follow home isolation for 10 days following symptom onset AND 24 hours fever free without use of fever-reducing meds before returning to school.
  - o Get a PCR or molecular COVID-19 test.
  - If the test is negative, return to school once symptoms are resolved or are improving.
  - If positive, follow home isolation for 10 days following symptoms onset AND 24 hours fever free without use of fever-reducing meds before returning to school.

The School Nurse or PSD health staff will determine when <u>a student</u> is able to return to school. School administrators, department leaders, or supervisors will communicate with staff about their return to work.

### Join PSD's Efforts to Support Students Experiencing Homelessness.

During the 2020-2021 school year, Poudre School District identified **1,432 students** pre-k through 12<sup>th</sup> grade, or **4.7% of our student population**, who experienced some form of homelessness and qualified for McKinney-Vento services.

McKinney-Vento is a federal law and PSD program designed to provide students experiencing homelessness and housing insecurity with resources and protections. The main focus is to remove the educational barriers that those students face, placing an emphasis on immediate enrollment, attendance, and success. McKinney-Vento services are available to all PSD children and youth, from birth to 21 years of age, who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence.   coats, hygiene and household supplies, food, concurrent enrollment supplies, and much more.
   Our goal is to provide services that remove barriers and create a welcoming and safe school
  environment so that students can come to school, engage in learning, and succeed.
