

PSD Learning Schedules for Emergency Remote Days





Due to the extended Thanksgiving break and the snow day on February 2nd we are getting close to the district's allotted snow days for the year. As many of us know the potential of spring snowstorms is strong, especially in the Mountain Schools, so there may be a need to have a remote learning day in lieu of a snow day.

Any time our schools must shift to online learning due to unforeseen circumstances such as inclement weather, we will be instituting a shortened online learning schedule. During these closures to in-person learning, students will receive synchronous direct instruction on a shortened schedule, with additional asynchronous time to complete assignments.

These are the procedures we will take for the possibility of a remote learning day due to inclement weather.

The Day Before

- We will watch the weather forecast and will send students home with the following items the day before the inclement weather. Please note we would send these items home for the *possibility* of a snowstorm. An official decision regarding the remote learning day will be made at 5:00 a.m. on the day of the storm.
 - Computer
 - Charger
 - Any materials needed for planned asynchronous work
- Mountain School secretaries will send a communication to families explaining supplies have been sent home for the possibility of a remote learning day and that an official decision will be made at 5:00 a.m. the next day. If the next day comes and the weather is okay, we will not call, we will proceed on a normal schedule, and students will need to bring their supplies back to school.

Remote Learning Day Due to Snow

- Communication will be sent at 5:00 a.m. (if you do not receive a 5:00 a.m. call, we will proceed on a normal inperson learning schedule, and students will need to bring their supplies back to school).
 - 9:00 a.m. 11:00 a.m.: Virtual Morning Class via Google Meet
 - 11:00 a.m. end of the day: Asynchronous Learning
 - 12:00 p.m. 2:00 p.m.: Office Hours. Teachers will hold office hours if your student needs additional support or has question

Instructional time is vitally important to supporting the continued academic success and well-being of our students, however we will be using a shortened schedule on these days so that families also have time to navigate other challenges that come with inclement weather.

Teachers have been practicing with students on how to access learning pages, google classroom, and google meet links so your student will be familiar with this process.

As we all know the heavy snow season has yet to come for the Mountain Schools and it is better to plan and be ready. If we need to have a remote learning day instead of a traditional snow day, we will be diligent at communicating so we are all prepared!
