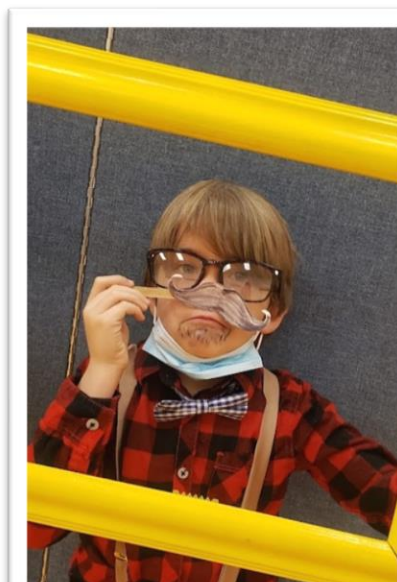

Dear Parents,

Valentines are optional, but if your student would like to participate in the Valentine exchange, they should bring a Valentine for each of his/her classmates in their homeroom class. Providing Valentine's for the entire student body is optional.

Your child will need to provide a box or bag to decorate and any special supplies they may want to use (we have some supplies, but not a lot.
