Dear 3rd – 5th Grade Families,

I would like to take a moment to talk about the Colorado Measures of Academic Success (CMAS) testing. First, it is important to understand what CMAS is. It is a state test, created in collaboration with Colorado teachers and administered by the Colorado Department of Education (CDE). Our teachers use the information we discover, through CMAS, as one tool to help reflect on their teaching effectiveness and plan future lesson adjustments.

We are recommending that all students take the test, however parents may opt students out from CMAS testing. The opt out form is attached to this email and must be returned no later than Friday, April 1, 2022.

If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact your student's teacher, any of our Mountain School secretaries, or myself. We would love to discuss CMAS with you and the importance it has in our ability to continue to provide an exceptional education for your student.

- April 4th, April 5th, April 6th Monday thru Wednesday 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. 4th 5th graders
- April 11th, April 12th, April 13th Monday thru Wednesday 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. 3rd 5th graders
- April 18th, April 19th, and April 20th Monday Wednesday 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. 3rd 5th graders

Please plan ahead. Refrain from making appointments during CMAS testing sessions. It is much easier for students to test in their regular classroom settings. Students who are absent during testing are required to make up the tests; we will need to pull them from classes during the week of April 25th to complete the tests.




PSD COVID-19 protocols for spring 2022

Our school district follows guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE) and Larimer County Department of Health and Environment (LCDHE).

PSD is a mask-friendly environment

We respect whatever choice staff, students and visitors make. The CDC continues to recommend that people wear the most protective mask they can that fits well and is worn consistently.

- Masks are no longer required on PSD buses or in PSD preschool classrooms, following updated CDC guidelines.
- Individuals who are COVID-positive must wear a mask in school/ at work on days 6-10, per public health requirements.
- Close contacts of positive individuals must wear a mask in school/at work on days 6-10 from their date of exposure, per public health requirements. More info: <u>cdc.gov</u>





Our layered approach to mitigation

PSD follows these recommended strategies to reduce the

- spread of contagious diseases:
- Stay home if you aren't feeling well and follow the state health department's <u>"How Sick is Too Sick?" protocols.</u>
- Maximize social distancing between members of different households, as possible.
- <u>Contact trace</u> when there are outbreaks

- and as otherwise required by the health department.
- Frequently clean and disinfect of our facilities, with a focus on high-traffic areas.
- Promote frequent handwashing.
- Make free COVID tests available, including through the <u>Test to Stay in PSD</u> program.
- Promote accessibility of <u>voluntary COVID</u> <u>vaccines</u> through state-run mobile clinics.

PSD COVID-19 protocols for spring 2022

Public health officials have shifted from a pandemic to a <u>more routine disease-control approach</u>. This more closely resembles how schools have historically responded to contagious diseases like whooping cough and influenza. For all protocols, please visit the <u>Health and Safety web page</u>.



What happens when there are COVID cases in PSD?

Contact tracing will occur:

- In a preschool classroom that reaches "cluster" status, or three to five cases.
- For classrooms/cohorts/ activities/teams that reach "outbreak" status, or five or more cases.

Parents/guardians can expect to receive communications at both points. Notifications are not sent for one case. The PSD data dashboard is at psdschools.org/psd2020-21/ COVID19schoolstatus. PSD works with the health department on contact tracing investigations to identify close contacts who must quarantine if they are not exempted. LCDHE issues legal isolation and quarantine orders.





How to be exempted from quarantine if you are a close contact

If staff or students are identified as close contacts of a COVIDpositive individual and receive quarantine orders from the health department, there are three options for them to remain at school or work. More info >>

Option 1: Op Be fully vaccinated Fo with a primary the series and boosted, PS if eligible.

Option 2 Follow all steps of the <u>Test to Stay in</u> PSD program. Option 3

Have record of a confirmed positive COVID test in the last 90 days.



Test to Stay in PSD

Test to Stay in PSD provides a separate option for students and staff to be exempted from quarantine, which means being able to teach, work and learn in school more often.

Step 1: Opt into CDPHE's Test to Stay program.

- Step 2: Get free at-home rapid tests from your school.
- Step 3: Staff members and students identified as close contacts must test on days 1 and 5, after their date of exposure.
- Step 4: Email copy of negative test results or a photo of a rapid, at-home tests (with date/time of result and name/ student or employee ID) to covidtracing@psdschools.org
- Step 5: Stay at school if asymptomatic and with a negative test result.
- Step 6: Request additional tests from your school health office if you have used yours.

What happens if my student has illness symptoms?

Have any of the symptoms below? You need a negative COVID test to return to school.

When not related to a documented chronic health condition, symptoms that require a negative test to return to school include fever, feeling feverish, shortness of breath, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, cough, sore throat, runny nose, congestion, muscle/body aches, headache, fatigue, new loss of sense of taste or smell. If your student tests positive or chooses not to test, they must remain home for five days and wear a mask on days 6 to 10 when they return, per public health requirements.
